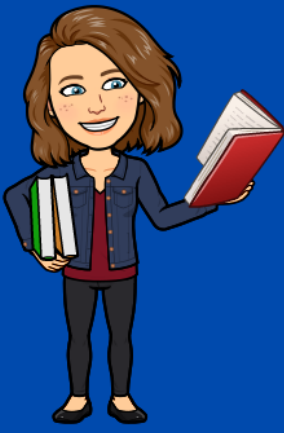

Course Overview

Students will be reading extensive and varied reading selections. Students will gain background knowledge via information passages before reading stories relating to those topics. Students will also work on reading fluency, vocabulary, literary analysis and writing. Students will have daily vocabulary, reading fluency, and comprehension practice. Students will complete portfolio projects throughout the year that will extend their understanding of various literary skills.

Grading Expectations

Students will be graded on their participation, completion of independent work, reading fluency checkouts, as well as reading comprehension tests. It is expected that students complete their assigned work by the due date listed in Google Classroom. Work is considered late if it is submitted after the posted due date.

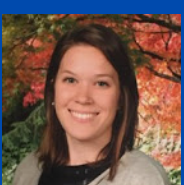
Reading Goals

All About Ms. Kaplan

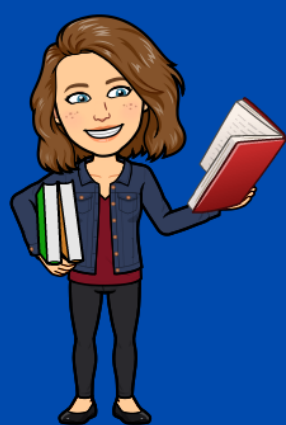
